30 Strategies · 300 Sub-Type Combinations · Grid, Pyramid & Recovery Engines

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1. Welcome to VITA AI SNIPER

VITA AI SNIPER is a multi-strategy Expert Advisor (EA) for MetaTrader 5. Think of it as a toolbox containing 30 different trading strategies — everything from classic Support & Resistance and Fibonacci retracements to institutional concepts like Order Blocks, Liquidity Sweeps and Smart Money Concepts (SMC). You choose which strategies watch the market, and the EA opens and manages trades for you automatically, according to the rules you set.

The EA is built around a simple idea: **you don't need to master 30 strategies** — you just need to tell VITA which ones to run, on which timeframes, and how much risk to take. Everything else (entries, stop losses, trailing, scaling in, filtering out bad conditions) is handled for you.

✓ TIP

This guide is written for traders who are new to VITA AI SNIPER. You do not need to understand every setting on day one — start with Section 3 (Quick Start) and Section 15 (Ready-Made Configurations), then explore deeper sections as you get comfortable.

What makes it different

- **30 strategies, 300 sub-types** — a huge library of market-reading logic, all built into one EA.
- **Three ways to combine strategies** — run them together for confirmation, side-by-side independently, or mix-and-match up to 10 at once.
- **Built-in risk tools** — ATR-based stops, smart trailing, a 5-level grid system, a profit-side pyramid system and an optional loss-recovery engine.
- **Market-condition filters** — trend, volatility, overbought/oversold and news filters that keep the EA out of unfavourable conditions.
- **Live dashboard** — an on-chart panel that shows what the EA is doing in real time.

2. Installing the EA on MetaTrader 5

1. Download the EA

Purchase or activate VITA AI SNIPER from the MQL5 Market page, then download it from the **Purchased** tab inside the MetaTrader 5 **Market** section (or copy the .ex5 file into your Experts folder if installing manually).

2. Open the Experts folder

In MT5, go to **File** → **Open Data Folder** → **MQL5** → **Experts**. Place the EA file here if you installed it manually.

3. Restart / Refresh MT5

Close and reopen MetaTrader 5, or right-click **Expert Advisors** in the Navigator panel and choose **Refresh**.

4. Enable Algo Trading

Click the **Algo Trading** button in the MT5 toolbar so it turns green. The EA cannot place trades while this is off.

5. Attach to a chart

Open a chart for the instrument you want to trade (the EA is tuned for **XAUUSD / Gold**, but the strategy engine works on other symbols too). Drag **VITA AI SNIPER** from the Navigator onto the chart.

6. Allow live trading

In the settings window that opens, go to the **Common** tab and tick **Allow Algo Trading**. Review the **Inputs** tab before clicking OK (see Section 3).

7. Confirm it's running

A smiling face icon should appear in the top-right corner of the chart, and the on-chart dashboard panel should appear (see Section 14).

■ IMPORTANT

Always test a new EA on a **demo account** first, ideally combined with the Strategy Tester, before risking real funds. Past performance on historical data does not guarantee future results.

3. Quick Start — Your First 10 Minutes

VITA AI SNIPER has hundreds of inputs, which can feel overwhelming. You only need to touch a handful of them to get a sensible first run going. Here is the fastest path:

Setting	Where to find it	Beginner recommendation
Strategy Mode	Strategy Engine	Leave on Multi-Select Mode — the simplest way to combine a few strategies (Section 6).
Lot size	Lot Size Management	Use a small fixed lot, or enable auto-lot sized to a fixed % risk, while you observe behaviour.
Max Positions	Core Trading	Keep the default (5) until you understand the Grid/Pyramid systems.
Stop Loss	Stop Loss & Smart Trailing	Leave ATR-based Take Profit on and review the SL pip value for your instrument's volatility.
Grid System	Grid System — 5 Levels	Leave disabled until you've read Section 9.
Recovery Engine	Recovery Engine	Leave disabled until you've read Section 11 in full.
News Filter	News Filter	Leave enabled — it keeps the EA out of the market during high-impact news.
Trading Hours	Time Settings	Set to match the sessions you actually want to trade (London/New York by default).

Run the EA on a demo account for at least a few weeks — ideally alongside a Strategy Tester backtest/optimisation covering several months of data — before adjusting the deeper settings described later in this guide.

4. How the Strategy Engine Thinks

Every strategy inside VITA AI SNIPER answers one question, over and over, on every new price bar: *"Does the market right now look like a valid Buy, a valid Sell, or neither?"* Each of the 30 strategies has its own way of answering that question — one watches candlestick patterns, another watches institutional order blocks, another watches Fibonacci levels, and so on.

What differs between traders is **how many of those opinions must agree**, and **what happens once they do**. That's the job of the Strategy Mode, covered in Section 6. Each strategy can also be given its own **sub-type** (a specific flavour of that strategy — for example, Order Block has 10 sub-types such as Classic, Breaker, Mitigation, and more) and its own **analysis timeframe**, so a fast M1 candlestick signal can work alongside a slower H4 Fibonacci signal in the same EA.

Sub-strategy anatomy

- **Strategy** — the general concept, e.g. Order Block, Divergence, Session Breakout.
- **Sub-type** — the specific rule-set within that concept, e.g. "Breaker Block Retest" vs. "Classic Order Block".
- **Timeframe** — which chart period the strategy analyses, independent of your chart's own timeframe.
- **Pending order style** (Multi-Select mode) — how the resulting signal is actually placed as an order.

■ NOTE

With 30 strategies × 10 sub-types, VITA AI SNIPER offers 300 possible signal engines. You are never expected to use them all — most traders run 1-5 that suit their style.

5. The 30 Strategies at a Glance

The strategies are grouped below into three families to make them easier to navigate. Every strategy listed has 10 selectable sub-types and its own dedicated analysis timeframe input.

Smart-Money & ICT Family

#	Strategy	In plain English
1	ICT Order Block (OB)	Trades from zones where large institutional orders likely originated.
2	Fair Value Gap (FVG)	Trades price back into imbalanced gaps left by fast moves.
3	Support & Resistance	Classic bounce/break trading from swing-point price zones.
4	Order Flow (OF)	Reads short-term buying/selling pressure (spread & delta behaviour).
5	Change of Character (CHoCH)	Detects the market structure flipping from up to down or vice versa.
6	VWAP Deviation Band	Trades reversion to, or breakout from, the volume-weighted average price.
7	Wyckoff Spring/Upthrust	Classic Wyckoff accumulation/distribution trap reversal signals.
8	Liquidity Sweep	Trades the snap-back after price hunts stop-losses beyond a recent high/low.
9	Multi-TF Momentum	Combines RSI and MACD momentum across timeframes.
10	Power Candle Patterns	Engulfing, hammer and other single/multi-candle reversal patterns.
11	Price Action Patterns	Pin bars and other pure price-action reversal setups.
12	Smart Money Concepts (SMC)	A full ICT-style toolkit: BOS, liquidity, OTE, kill zones and more.

Classical Technical-Analysis Family

#	Strategy	In plain English
13	Harmonic Patterns	Gartley, Bat, Crab and similar geometric reversal patterns.
14	Volume / Market Profile	Trades reactions around the point of control and value area.
15	Ichimoku Kinko Hyo	Cloud, Tenkan/Kijun cross and related Ichimoku signals.
16	Fibonacci Retrace/Extension	Entries at classic Fibonacci retracement and extension levels.
17	Divergence (RSI/MACD)	Trades when price and momentum indicators disagree.
18	Elliott Wave Structure	Attempts to trade impulse/corrective wave positioning.
19	Session Range Breakout	Breakouts from the Asian, London or New York session range.
20	MA Ribbon Trend Confluence	Trades trend strength shown by a fan of moving averages.
21	Volatility Burst	Catches fast directional thrusts in volatility (gap/thrust moves).

Advanced & Institutional Family

#	Strategy	In plain English
22	Order Block Confluence+	Multi-timeframe agreement between order blocks.
23	Gamma Zone	Options-inspired round-number and weekly pivot-style levels.
24	Institutional Flow Fingerprint	Detects footprints of large players via climax/reversal behaviour.
25	Regression Channel Breakout	Breaks of a statistically-fitted price channel.
26	Market Microstructure Signals	Reads spread compression and micro order-book behaviour.
27	Intermarket Correlation Proxy	Uses related-market behaviour (e.g. VWAP divergence) as a proxy signal.
28	Adaptive Volatility Regime	Adjusts entries to the current low/high volatility regime.
29	Time-of-Day Momentum Burst	Targets recurring momentum bursts around session opens (e.g. London Open).
30	Multi-Timeframe Structural Confluence	Requires multiple timeframes to agree on market structure.

6. Choosing a Strategy Mode

Mode	How it behaves	Best for
Multi-Strategy Confluence	Turns on any number of the 30 strategies as "votes". A trade only fires once at least Min Confirmations of them agree on the same direction at the same time.	Traders who want fewer, higher-conviction trades.
Independent Mode	Every enabled strategy trades completely on its own, opening its own trades whenever it sees a signal, up to a per-strategy trade limit.	Traders who want each strategy to run as its own mini-system in parallel.
Multi-Select Mode (<i>default, recommended for most users</i>)	You pick up to 10 specific sub-strategies (from the full 300-item list) into numbered slots, each with its own timeframe and pending-order style. Whichever slot fires first places the trade (first-match, OR logic) — or, using Slot X and Minimum Agreement settings, you can require several slots to agree first.	Traders who want fine control over an exact hand-picked combination without configuring all 30 strategies individually.

Inside Multi-Select Mode

- **Slot 1–10** — each slot holds one sub-strategy, its own timeframe, and its own pending order type.
- **Slot X** — an optional master filter: if set, every other slot's signal must agree with Slot X before a trade is allowed.
- **Independent Slots** — when enabled, each slot can stack its own trades instead of waiting for others; a max-per-slot limit and pending-order expiry keep this in check.
- **Minimum Agreement** — an alternative to first-match logic: require N enabled slots to agree simultaneously before the shared trade fires.

7. Stop Loss, Take Profit & Smart Trailing

Every trade VITA AI SNIPER opens is protected by a stop loss. You can set this as a fixed pip value, or let it scale automatically with current market volatility using the Average True Range (ATR) — the recommended approach, since a fixed pip stop that works in a quiet market can be far too tight in a volatile one.

Feature	What it does
ATR-based SL / TP	Stop loss and/or take profit distance are calculated as a multiple of the current ATR reading, so they automatically widen in volatile conditions and tighten in calm ones.
Smart Trailing Stop	Once a trade reaches a set profit (in pips), the stop loss trails behind price to lock in gains, stepping forward as profit grows.
Break-even on Grid L2	Optionally moves the stop loss to break-even once the second grid level closes in profit.
Tighten on Grid L3	Optionally halves the trailing step once the third grid level closes in profit, locking in gains faster.

■ NOTE

Trailing and grid break-even rules only apply once a trade is already in profit — they exist to protect gains, not to create them.

8. Pending Order Styles

Instead of always buying or selling at the current market price, VITA AI SNIPER can place a pending order that only fills if price confirms the move — useful for avoiding false breakouts. Each Multi-Select slot can use a different style:

Style	What it does
Stop Orders Only	Places a Buy Stop / Sell Stop beyond the signal price — enters only if price continues in the signal's direction.
Limit Orders Only	Places a Buy Limit / Sell Limit — enters only on a pullback to a better price.
Stop + Limit (dual bracket)	Places both a stop and a limit order; whichever fills first cancels the other.
Market Orders	Enters immediately at the current price (the original, simplest behaviour).
Breakout Straddle	Places pending orders on both sides of price; the first fill cancels the other side.
Scaled Ladder Entry	Stages several legs at increasing distance, with a decaying lot size per leg.
Native Stop-Limit	A trigger-stop price that then fills as a limit order, for tighter slippage control.
Liquidity Pool Sweep Entry	Places the order just beyond a recent session high/low, targeting a stop-hunt reaction.
ATR-Adaptive Offset	Sets the pending order's distance from price as a multiple of current ATR.
Iceberg Scale-In	Splits the position across several price tiers rather than one single fill.

9. The Grid System

The Grid System adds up to 5 further positions in the same direction as your original trade, spaced out at set price intervals, each with its own take-profit target and lot multiplier. It is designed to average an entry and harvest small profits from choppy or ranging price action.

- **Spacing style** — Linear, accelerating or ATR-based distance between each of the 5 levels.
- **Lot multiplier** — how much larger each new grid level's lot size is versus the previous one.
- **Per-level take profit** — each of the 5 levels has its own independent TP target in pips.
- **Smart Entry Filter** — can require Fair Value Gap and/or Order Flow confirmation before adding a grid level, rather than adding purely on price distance.
- **Reversal-Confirmation Mode** — an alternative mode that waits for a specific M1 reversal candle (pin bar, engulfing, momentum, etc.) before adding a level, instead of adding immediately.

■ IMPORTANT

Grid trading increases exposure the further price moves against the original entry, and lot sizes typically increase with each level. This can produce a larger drawdown than single-trade strategies. Only enable the Grid System after testing it thoroughly on demo and understanding the total lot exposure it can build up (governed by **Max Total Positions**).

10. The Pyramid System

Where the Grid System adds to a trade that is moving against you, the Pyramid System does the opposite: it adds further positions **only as a trade moves into profit**, in the same direction. It offers up to 3 additional levels, each usually sized smaller than the last.

Pyramid Style	How adds are triggered
Classic	Equal price intervals, with lot size decaying at each step.
Fibonacci	Profit milestones widen by roughly a 1-2-4x golden-ratio-style progression.
Momentum Burst	Adds accelerate — trigger sooner — as the trend keeps strengthening.
Structure Break	Only adds when price makes a genuinely fresh swing high/low.
Pullback & Resume	Waits for a shallow retrace that holds, then adds as price resumes.
Scale Ladder	Tight, quick take-profits with shrinking lot sizes at each level.

By default, pyramid adds share the anchor trade's own (trailing) stop loss, so the whole pyramid moves together once trailing activates.

11. The Recovery Engine (Read Before Using)

■ IMPORTANT

The Recovery Engine changes position sizing and/or direction **after a loss**, in an attempt to recoup it. Several of its modes (Martingale, Target-Recover, Ladder Recovery) can increase lot size after losses. This can substantially increase account risk if a losing streak continues, and can lead to large drawdowns or account loss if left unchecked. Understand a mode completely — and test it extensively on demo — before enabling it on a live account.

Mode	Concept
Classic Martingale	Doubles the lot size after each loss.
Anti-Martingale	Shrinks the lot size after a loss, to protect equity instead.
D'Alembert	Adds one fixed lot step after each loss (gentler than Martingale).
Fibonacci Sequence	Scales lot size up the Fibonacci sequence after consecutive losses.
Percent Step-Up	Increases lot size by a fixed percentage after each loss.
Target-Recover	Sizes the next trade specifically to recoup the cumulative loss so far.
Reverse Direction	Fades the losing trade — re-enters in the opposite direction.
Repeat Direction	Re-enters the same direction as a conviction trade.
Zone Hedge	Places a pending hedge order at a set distance from the loss price.
Ladder Recovery	Stages several pending orders at increasing distance and size.
Confluence Boost	Requires extra confirmations before allowing the next recovery trade.
Cooldown Wait	Simply pauses trading for a set number of bars after a loss — the lowest-risk option.

Safety controls available: a minimum loss (in pips) before recovery engages, a maximum number of consecutive recovery steps, an absolute lot-size cap, and the option to reset recovery state after the first win. The engine can also use its own dedicated stop loss/take profit and require its own signal-strategy confirmation before re-entering.

12. Protective Filters

Filters don't generate trade signals themselves — they **veto** trades that would otherwise fire, when market conditions look unfavourable. Several filters can run at once.

Filter	What it checks
Trend Filter Engine	Six modes (single/dual/triple EMA stack, ADX strength, Ichimoku cloud) that require the broader trend to agree with the trade direction.
Volatility Filter Engine	Five modes (ATR range gate, ATR spike block, Bollinger Band width gate, spread-only) that block trading in abnormally quiet or abnormally explosive conditions.
Overbought/Oversold Filter	RSI, Stochastic, CCI or Williams %R — blocks new Buys when overbought and new Sells when oversold.
News Filter (Economic Calendar)	Blocks trading around high/medium-impact news, with dedicated always-block rules for CPI and NFP releases, for a configurable window before and after.
Trading Hours & Sessions	Restricts trading to chosen server hours and/or Asian, London and New York sessions.
Day-of-Week Filter	Optionally skips the volatile Monday-open window and stops new trades before Friday's close.
Max Spread Filter	Blocks new trades whenever the live spread exceeds your chosen pip limit.

■ NOTE

All filters apply globally, across every strategy mode. If the EA seems unusually quiet, check whether a filter is currently blocking trades before assuming something is broken.

13. Speed Modes — Normal / Slow / Aggressive

Speed Mode controls the overall pacing of the EA — each of the three modes has its own chart timeframe, minimum time between trades, stop loss, and win-streak lot scaling setting, so you can switch your entire trading tempo with a single input rather than reconfiguring dozens of settings.

Mode	Typical use
Normal	A balanced default pace — the sensible starting point for most users.
Slow	Wider spacing between trades and calmer entries — suited to lower-maintenance, longer-hold trading.
Aggressive	Tighter spacing between trades and win-streak lot scaling enabled by default — suited to experienced users comfortable with higher trade frequency and variance.

14. The On-Chart Dashboard & Alerts

When attached to a chart, VITA AI SNIPER draws a live panel (position and colours configurable) showing what the strategy engine is currently doing — active strategies, confirmations, open trades and grid/pyramid/recovery status — plus a rotating confirmation-breakdown panel so you can see exactly why (or why not) a signal is qualifying for a trade.

- **Show Panel** — toggle the dashboard on or off, and set its X/Y position on the chart.
- **Confirmation Breakdown Panel** — shows which strategies are currently agreeing or disagreeing.
- **Order Block colours** — bullish and bearish order-block zones are drawn on the chart in distinct colours you can customise.
- **Sound Alerts** — optional audio cues when a signal fires and when an order is filled, each with its own configurable sound file.

15. Three Ready-Made Starting Configurations

If you'd rather not build a configuration from scratch, here are three sensible starting points. Treat these as a starting point for your own testing and optimisation — not as guaranteed results.

■ Conservative

Fewer, higher-conviction trades with tight protective filters. Aimed at traders who prioritise capital preservation over trade frequency.

Setting	Suggestion
Strategy Mode	Multi-Strategy Confluence, Min Confirmations 3+
Speed Mode	Slow
Grid / Pyramid / Recovery	All disabled
Trend + Volatility Filters	Enabled, moderate settings
News Filter	Enabled, 30 min before/after

■ Balanced

The EA's own defaults — Multi-Select Mode with a handful of hand-picked slots, moderate grid usage disabled by default. A reasonable middle ground while you learn the EA.

Setting	Suggestion
Strategy Mode	Multi-Select Mode (default slots)
Speed Mode	Normal
Grid System	Optional — test thoroughly first
Recovery Engine	Disabled
News Filter	Enabled

■ Aggressive (experienced users only)

Higher trade frequency, win-streak lot scaling and multiple simultaneous strategies. Expect larger swings in equity in both directions.

Setting	Suggestion
Strategy Mode	Multi-Select Mode with Independent Slots, or Independent Mode

Setting	Suggestion
Speed Mode	Aggressive
Grid / Pyramid	Can be enabled after demo testing
Recovery Engine	Use only low-risk modes (Cooldown Wait, Confluence Boost) if at all
Position sizing	Keep an absolute lot cap regardless of scaling settings

16. Troubleshooting & FAQ

Q: The EA isn't opening any trades.

A: Check: (1) the Algo Trading button is green, (2) "Allow Algo Trading" is ticked in the EA's Common tab, (3) you're within your configured Trading Hours/Session, (4) no filter (trend, volatility, spread, news) is currently vetoing signals, and (5) at least one strategy or Multi-Select slot is actually enabled.

Q: The smiling face icon isn't showing.

A: This means the EA isn't attached correctly, or Algo Trading is disabled globally. Re-attach the EA and re-check the toolbar toggle.

Q: Trades are opening more often than I expected.

A: Check how many strategies/slots are enabled at once, whether Independent Slots is on (which lets slots stack trades), and your Speed Mode's minimum seconds between trades.

Q: The dashboard panel isn't visible.

A: Confirm Show Panel is enabled and that its X/Y position isn't placed off-screen for your chart size.

Q: I want to test settings without risking money.

A: Use the MetaTrader 5 Strategy Tester with historical data before running any new configuration live. This is the best way to understand how the Grid, Pyramid and Recovery systems behave together.

Q: Which symbol should I run this on?

A: The EA is tuned primarily for XAUUSD (Gold), but the underlying strategy engine works on other forex, index or crypto symbols too — re-test settings like ATR and pip-based distances per symbol, since volatility differs significantly between instruments.
